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## Speaker Biographies

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### **Douglas Arner**

*Kerry Holdings Professor in Law at the University of Hong Kong*

Douglas W. Arner is the Kerry Holdings Professor in Law, an RGC Senior Fellow, and Associate Dean of the Faculty of Law at the University of Hong Kong. At HKU, he co-founded and is the Faculty Director of the LLM Compliance and Regulation, LLM Corporate and Financial Law, LITE (Law, Innovation, Technology and Entrepreneurship), and EAIEL (East Asian International Economic Law and Policy) Programmes. Douglas specialises in economic and financial law, regulation and development. Douglas has been a visiting professor or fellow at Duke University, Harvard University, the Hong Kong Institute for Monetary Research, IDC Herzliya, McGill University, Melbourne University, National University of Singapore, Queen Mary University of London, University of New South Wales, Shanghai University of Finance and Economics, and Zurich University, among others.

He holds a BA from Drury College (where he studied literature, economics and political science), a JD (cum lauded) from Southern Methodist University, an LLM (with distinction) in banking and finance law from the University of London (Queen Mary College), and PhD from the University of London.

### **Emma Burger**

*ESG Data Product Manager at Bloomberg*

Emma Burger is an ESG Data Product Manager within Bloomberg's Data department. Prior to joining the Commission, Jo-Anne practised corporate and securities law in Toronto, Ontario and London, England. Jo-Anne received her Bachelor of Commerce (Honours) from Queen's University and her Bachelor of Laws from the University of Toronto.

**Mark Manning**

*Technical Specialist in Sustainable Finance and Stewardship at the U.K. Financial Conduct Authority and Co-Chair of the Assurance Work Stream of the IOSCO Sustainable Finance Task Force*

Mark Manning is Strategic Policy Advisor in Sustainable Finance at the U.K. Financial Conduct Authority, where he develops strategic policy in sustainable finance, domestically and internationally, with a special focus on sustainability disclosures and transition planning. He also spent several years as a fixed income and currency fund manager with Kleinwort Benson Investment Management and Goldman Sachs Asset Management. Mark holds Master's degrees in Economics and Finance, from University College London and London Business School, respectively.

**Jeanne Stampe**

*Specialist Leader on Sustainable Finance Disclosures at the Monetary Authority of Singapore*

Jeanne is a Specialist Leader (Sustainable Finance Disclosures) at the Monetary Authority of Singapore, focusing on sustainable finance regulations and supervision. She is an active member of international sustainable finance platforms for central banks, financial supervisors and securities regulators (NGFS, IOSCO STF, BCBS TFCR, IAIS). Jeanne is a Senior Fellow at the SOAS University of London Centre for Sustainable Finance, which is part of the International Network for Sustainable Financial Policy Insights, Research and Exchange (INSPIRE) research network. She has co-authored or contributed to over 20 publications and policy reports on sustainable banking and responsible investment. Between 2011 and 2020, Jeanne was Head of Asia Sustainable Finance at WWF Asia. Jeanne created and led WWF's Asia Sustainable Finance Programme and was part of the Global Finance Practice leadership team. Jeanne helmed advocacy, advisory and capacity building efforts for financial institutions across Asia. She worked with ASEAN banking supervisors to support the development of their sustainable banking guidelines. Prior to this, she worked 14 years in private equity and investment banking in London, New York, Stockholm and Singapore. Jeanne holds a BA (Hons) and MA (Cantab) in Economics from Cambridge University.

**Stefan Gavell**

*Vice Chair of Executive Education at the Program on International Financial Systems*

Stefan Gavell was previously Executive Vice President and Global Head of Regulatory, Industry and Government Affairs for State Street Corporation with responsibility for global regulatory, industry and government relations. In this position, he was responsible for representing State Street with regulators, legislators and other policymakers worldwide.
